## UNDERSTANDING SOCIETAL IMPACT OF SCIENCE

### Understanding societal impact of science

- Science is increasingly expected to help in solving complex societal problems in collaboration with society touching upon areas e.g. migration, sustainability health issues
- Impact assessments are becoming more and more relevant
  - Research Excellence Framework (UK)
  - Standard Evaluation protocol in the Netherlands
  - Excellence in research Framework in Australia
- Often unclear under what conditions this can happen: which challenges and quality expectations prevail



### **Concept of impact**

- The relationship between science and society is described as "from deficit to dialogue" (Bucchi, Davies, Reincke)
- "Socially robust knowledge": not only close cognitive gaps, but also social gaps (Nowotny, Weingart)
- Societal impact requires interaction between scientific and societal actors



### What's special about the SSH?

- On the epistemic level: Boundaries between subjects, investigators and audiences have a tendency to become blurred in SSH research
- Socio-organizational level: Centrally organized structures focusing on broad public communication
- Communication level: Overly specialized and obscure terms vs everyday observations of individuals they engage with
- Assessment level: Economic and purely quantitative measurements discriminate SSH knowledge outputs


# Researchers' perspective on impact

The communications department in my institution manages to communicate my research to relevant stakeholders in society


In my institution, knowledge transfer to society plays an important role.

Institutional Lack of resources -> media campaign will not be

challenges enough

Lack of organizational support

Lack of rewards -> everything beyond

publications "for free"

**Epistemic** Ambiguity of results -> no single solutions
